## Parish Priest Report – APCM 2024

## Dear Friends,

I would like to begin my report with a heartfelt thank you to each and every one of you. Beatrice and our family truly feel the warmth of your love and support, and I cannot express enough how much of a blessing you all are to my ministry. Your friendship, encouragement, and most importantly, your prayers, form the bedrock of my work alongside you. We are incredibly fortunate at St. Andrew's to be part of such a caring and nurturing community. My hope and prayer are that we continue to experience God's abundant blessings as we deepen our understanding of what it means to be members of the Body of Christ.

Though 2023 may feel like a distant memory, it has been a year of significant growth for St. Andrew's Church across various aspects of our communal life. It's impossible to capture every detail in this report, but I am deeply grateful to God for the abundance of blessings we've experienced. Allow me to highlight a few key moments from the past year.

Firstly, we had the PCC Away Day which was held at the Living Well. This gave the PCC an opportunity to review our Mission Action Plan, and to plan for the future. We were able to explore our strength, challenges and opportunities for growth at St Andrew's. Please pray for God's blessing as we seek to implement our Mission Plan. We need to continue being a church that is responding to the call of Christ in every part of our lives; a church whose focus is on making new disciples, and helping them to encounter the Lord Jesus and his transforming power.

Secondly, Messy Church met a number of times and was well supported by our local schools. It was a joy to see so many children with their parents attend every time it was held. We have a lot of activities including Bible stories with plenty of participation, and conclude with a family tea. It is a blessing to have a team of volunteers that is committed and make the afternoon a success. Thank you to every one for your support and especially Hilary & Julian who did all the organising and producing the teaching material. Thank you for your time and dedication to this wonderful outreach initiative. However, I am sorry to say that we haven't had a Messy Church meeting this year, due to the lack of enough volunteers. We need more volunteers for this important mission initiative to flourish. Please pray and if you feel moved to help – then it will be lovely to hear from you.

Thirdly, we held a Gift Day which was well supported not only by regular members of our church but by our local community. The Bible teaches that, "Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (Corinthians 9:7). This is exactly what we witnessed on the 23<sup>rd</sup> September, people gave generously to God's Church. A sum of over £7000 was raised. A big thank you to everyone for your generosity.

We also held our annual Open Gardens event in which people in our local community opened their gardens to the public. Thank you to Linda Owen and her team of volunteers for organising this wonderful event. It was a great pleasure, enjoying many different designs of gardens with beautiful plants. Following this event, we invited the gardeners to a "Thank you high tea with entertainment" in the community hall. This strengthened the bond between St Andrew's and the local community, especially seeing everyone enjoying getting together with us.

Another highlight of the year was the witnessing of first ever Coronation of a King in 70 years. On Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> May, we commemorated this historic event with a special Thanksgiving service held in the church; and a Street party. What a brilliant occasion. It was wonderful to see the Reading Street local community gathering to sing, dance and eat together. I was greatly encouraged to hear so many

positive comments about St Andrew's Church from people in the community whom we don't normally see.

The devotional life of the church is blessed as we continue with our witness and service, and we are all extremely encouraged by so many parents bringing their children to church for holy baptism. The greater blessing is the families who continue to join us and offer worship with us.

It is encouraging to see our Junior church grow in numbers, through the dedication of Sharon, Fiona Maxine and all the helpers who teach these children.

It has been a real joy for me over my time here to build relationships with our local schools St Peter's Junior and Callis Grange schools as a governor but also as a visitor to the schools through assemblies and other invitations. Having these schools visit the church regularly is also a real blessing and pleasure and the services we have shared together have been wonderful times of celebration. I very much hope these relationships continue to develop and my prayer is that with time some of you will feel confident and able to join me in this work in and with the schools.

The refurbishment of the Community hall has made a big difference to the witness of the church at St Andrew's. The local community is impressed to know that it has a home at St Andrew's. And now the work of fitting a new kitchen is well and truly underway. We are all thankful to those who have generously given towards this project. I'm fully aware of all the effort that has been put in towards us achieving our goal. We take this opportunity to give special thanks Graham and his team of volunteers for the wonderful work they have done and continues to do.
